Playtime Fun at Springview!

Pupils at Springview Campus were very enthusiastic when they returned to school in September, at the sight of an in-built trampoline and brand new climbing frame! These two fabulous additions to the playground and field area have become firm favourites with many of our pupils, so much so, we have had to create a timing system for the trampoline with a five minute timer and pupils 'waiting their turn'! Many thanks to FOGS who, having raised over £24,000, fully funded the climbing frame.

We are confident this equipment will be loved for many years to come.

Our next project for the playground is to further enhance the experiences and opportunities for pre-formal learners.

We have secured some additional funding for this, so keep an eye out over the next few months!









As part of our ongoing development programme, improving facilities within the school, Waterside Campus has begun to re-establish a Horticulture and Small Animal area. This space, which is situated in front of our Forest School will house a number of planters, a poly tunnel, green house and small animal shelter. This month we have had Creative Play on site installing our new planters and small animal shelter. Pupils have already begun to plant seasonal seeds into these beds including spinach, radishes and tulips. We look forward to having these areas finalised so we can continue to teach pupils valuable skills which are important for adult life and employment.

Universal Music UK Sound Foundation




### **Design technology**





Grapes Class loved the bouncy castle that we had available this term! Lots of fun and smiles










This term, we have started swimming again! It has been wonderful to see how much confidence and independence the pupils have developed over the term while exploring some of our new swimming pool toys!

What an amazing start to the new academic year. Having welcomed both new classmates and adults in to Pears Class, we are starting to feel settled into our new routines.













Our Topic this term has been 'Myself'. We have done an array of exploration and a variety of activities that link with our topic. Everyone has worked hard and had great fun!

Strawberries class have had a fantastic return to school. This term our topic work is focused on 'Around the World', in particular famous landmarks.






Pupils have really enjoyed their options subjects and have demonstrated great practical skills in a range of areas to include; horticulture; art; drama; PE and cookery.

#### Maths in Hazel
