



Provision Map – Attendance

Pupil has low attendance, below 90%. Is there attendance a cause for concern?

Although the pupil's absence is below 90% there are clear extenuating circumstances. For example, the child suffers from a complex medical condition which means they are routinely absent for medical appointments or are more likely to be absent as they are frequently unwell.

What is the area of concern?

There is evidence that although the child has complex health needs these needs are not being met and therefore impacting attendance.

There is evidence of emotional based school avoidance or identified mental health needs.

Other circumstances e.g. school refuser, relationship issues, pressure within the local community.

Initiate an attendance review meeting and complete an attendance improvement plan.
Assess – Plan – Do - Review

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Consider the following interventions and support from external professionals.

- Multi-agency meeting with health professional.
- Referral to the Children with Disabilities Team.
- Consider completion of an Early Help Assessment.
- Bespoke school offer to improve attendance.
- Additional regular meetings to develop trust between home and school.

Consider the following interventions and support from external professionals.

- Completion of EBSA Screening.
- Targeted intervention, as appropriate within the EBSA Pathway.
- Referral to Mental Health services.
- Multi-agency meeting with professionals involved.
- Referral to the Children with Disabilities Team.
- Completion of an Early Help Assessment.
- Bespoke school offer to improve attendance.

Consider the following interventions and support from external professionals.

- Multi-agency meeting with professionals involved.
- Referral to the Children with Disabilities Team.
- Completion of an Early Help Assessment.
- Request support from the Lincolnshire Young Carers Service.
- Bespoke school offer to improve attendance.
- Fixed penalty notices and/or parental prosecution.
