Our STEM sessions this term is focused on out topic 'transport' and last week we looked at how cars move before creating and designing ramps to look at how these affect cars movements by racing them and problem solving to create working



ramps. We have been exploring Robin Hood and Sherwood Forest in humanities, who seems to be popular amongst pupils.









We have explored the forest and looked at where Nottingham is in relation to the UK, talking about the adventures Robin found himself on and even created our own forest collages using different mediums.
