<u>Hazel Class:</u> Hazel class spent some time outside doing






We had a fantastic day learning about China and took part in a Chinese dance workshop.

We have already packed so much into our learning and had so many special visitors to

help us along the way.

In English and Communication, we have been following instructions and beginning to sequence using photos and symbols.

Pupils have then enjoyed role playing how to care for a dog, making sure they follow the sequence correctly.



In Maths and Cognition, we have started our learning on multiplication, using arrays - a visual diagram, where we have used practical resources to support pupils in their knowledge of counting in 1's or 2's.

Our STEM learning has been our favourite so far this term, with some wonderful opportunities being offered in school. We have had visits from AJ the dog, Chocolate the pony,



Heinz, the sheep and April the lamb, as well as some hand-on experiences with tortoises, chickens, rabbits and Nigel, the snail! We have been exploring about how to care for different types of animals, as well as learning about the types of habitats they can have. A huge thank you to the external visitors, parents/carers and staff in school for supporting and providing these wonderful opportunities for Pupils at Springview!



Finally, some pupils in Pears and Pineapples have been horse riding this term. It's been lovely to see pupils' confidence and self-esteem thrive in this environment, especially after just two sessions.

<u>Sycamore Class:</u> Since returning from half term, Sycamore have been busy and continuing their hard. In the first week pupils took part in some travel training, taking a train to Peterborough and back. Everyone enjoyed their time out, understanding how to

read timetables and mange time.

In PE pupils are focussing on striking and fielding this term. We have started with golf, and we could not have asked for better weather! Pupils have been practising power and direction, using various techniques.
