In English, we've been diving into persuasive writing, weighing up the pros and cons of zoos (spoiler alert: it sparked some passionate debates!).


Over in Maths, we've been collecting data and turning it into colourful charts – who knew statistics could be so satisfying?


Art has taken a hands-on turn as we've started

<u>Pineapples Class:</u> What a wonderful but wet experience it has been for our topic of 'Water' so far!

In English and Communication, pupils have encountered the fiction text called 'The Proudest Blue', where we learnt all about a sister who was experiencing her first hijab day. Pupils enjoyed listening to the story and then sequencing the order using pictures. In the following week, pupils then learnt about adjectives and matched words that could be used to describe three characters from the story, some of whom started to select words, from a choice of three.

In Maths and Cognition, Pineapples have been learning about the concept of division, using an array to organise images and resources. Pupils have used their number knowledge to count the total and then count the number of rows and columns to build a division number sentence, doing so with

increasing independence.

STEM has provided some lovely learning opportunities which began with Pineapples labelling different types of water sources. We then explored water through our senses and have continued to do



exploring wet and dry, using blindfolds, before communicating our answers. We enjoyed using food items like gravy, rice, flour and raisins to observe what might happen when they are added to water.











Our Careers Day, earlier in the term, was enjoyed by all! We loved having the opportunity to explore some construction equipment and vehicles. The Smoothie Bike provided by World Wide Fruits was a huge hit and allowed us to try and sample some unique smoothies – lemon being a popular ingredient. Visits from Pets at Home and Sainsbury's were engaging too, as well as our class session on yoga, where we learnt about the three components of a yoga session.



Let's dive straight back in Pineapples and make this a term to remember!

**Sycamore Class:** This term, Sycamore have continued to work hard in all lessons, whilst also preparing for our end of year activities. In maths, pupils have been focussing on targeted work. Pupils have recently looked at time, focussing on understanding the difference between 12- and 24- hour time. Pupils enjoyed some practical work using analogue clocks.

In English, pupils have been looking at non-fiction texts. They have focused on using organisational features such as glossaries and indexes to navigate a text and find information. Pupils have focused on a text called 'behind the scenes at the zoo'.



In Maths, we have been focusing on some real-life problems, such as time. Pupils have been using analogue clocks to convert 12- and 24- hour times. Pupils have shown their understanding of AM and PM through various activities.



In PE, pupils have been focusing on athletics. Firstly, we looked at javelin. We explored what grip we prefer, before going through steps to achieve power in our throws. Pupils thoroughly enjoyed this! As we are coming to the end of the year 11's time at Tulip academy, everyone is really making the most of each lesson and making every moment matter!

Pupils were lucky to be able to take part in a careers day that took place. Pupils had the opportunity to ask questions and get an insight in jobs and businesses. Some of these careers were drone flying, worldwide fruit and the NHS. Pupils found he day enjoyable and asked some great questions.
