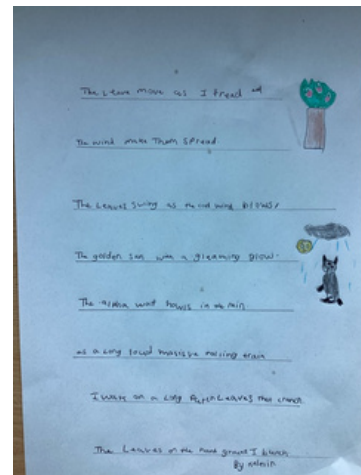

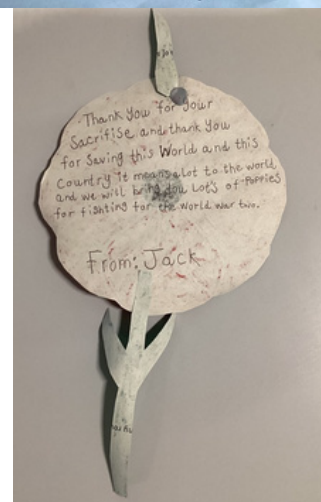
SYCAMORE CLASS NEWS

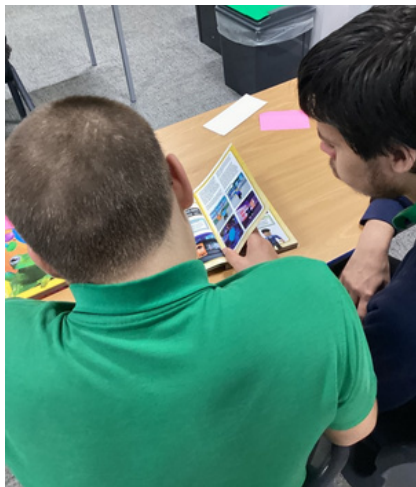
SPRUCE CLASS NEWS
