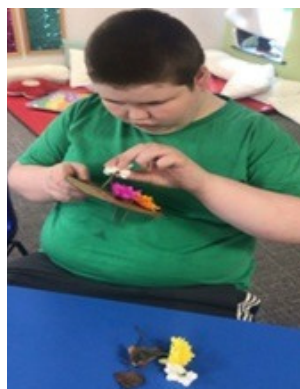
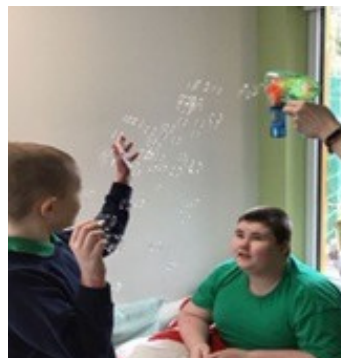
What a magical and busy term we've had!

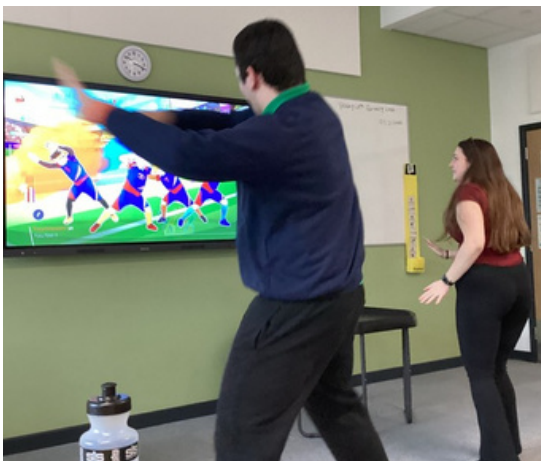
