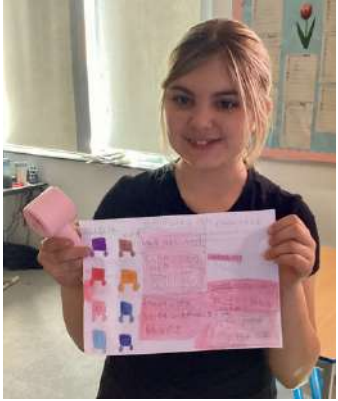

## OAK CLASS



Oak Class have had a fantastic term! 😊

In Maths, pupils have developed a stronger understanding of multiplication and division through practical activities involving equal groups, as well as improving their skills in measuring using water jugs, scales, and thermometers.

Our 'Going on Holiday' topic has inspired learning across STEM, Humanities, and English, with pupils creating lists and illustrations of items suitable for holidays in different climates. In English, pupils explored the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts. After visiting the library and choosing a non-fiction book, they used their growing formal writing skills to create fact files.



PE has focused on rounders and cricket skills, with Oak and Hazel classes working together on catching, throwing, and team games in preparation for the student vs teachers rounders match.

Intervention sessions have supported fine motor development, letter and number formation, and provided opportunities for teamwork, communication, and problem-solving through construction activities.
